This checklist can help you kick-start your own group use of Whitestone resources as easily as possible!

1.	Understand resources available for groups. The following documents are available for

		"Group Guide: Podcast" – guide for listening to weekly podcast episodes as a group
		"Timeline-Content Options" – guide for matching content with desired timeline
		"Seminar Notepad" printouts – for easy notetaking during seminars!
		"Application & Action" printouts – questions designed for individual reflection and
		group discussion, to dig deeper into Whitestone Seminars™ and Podcast™ episodes!
2.	To start a group, define:	
		Group members – e.g. co-workers, university students, church members, friends
		Cadence – e.g. once weekly, twice monthly, once monthly
		Time – e.g. Wednesday evening, Thursday morning, Sunday afternoon
		Material – e.g. weekly podcast episodes, seminar video series
		Location – e.g. conference room, church breakout room, coffee shop
3.	Before	e each meeting:
		Email / text reminder with pertinent details each week before the meeting
		Print out materials for each individual
		Ensure that device is ready to play content / test beforehand
		 Whitestone Podcast can be played via mobile or laptop
		 Although Whitestone Seminars are accessible via mobile, a group can more
		easily view material via laptop or television
4.	. During each meeting:	
		Play Whitestone content – e.g. podcast episode audio, seminar video of choice
		Go through Application & Action questions
		As appropriate, pray through calls to action
